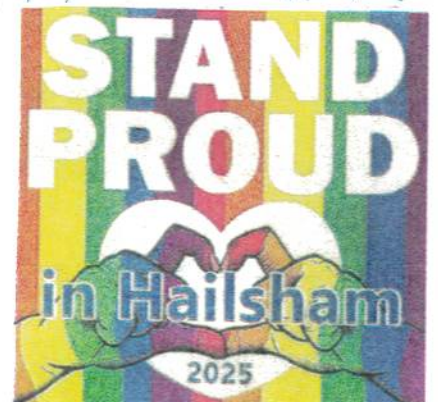



## Sports Page – June 2025

The month of June was a terribly busy one for Sport. The last match of the 2024 – 2025 Soccer Season took place at Wembley Stadium on June 1<sup>st</sup> and most players enjoyed a holiday for the whole of June. The exceptions were Chelsea and Manchester City who took part in the World Club Championships from June 14<sup>th</sup> until July 12<sup>th</sup>, so good luck to them for that.

Three major Horse Racing events and many lesser ones took place during the month of June. They were the Oaks on June 6<sup>th</sup>, the Derby on June 7<sup>th</sup> and the Royal Ascot meeting from June 17<sup>th</sup> until June 21<sup>st</sup>.

In Cricket, the main events of the month were a one-day series of matches between England and the West Indies on June 6<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup>, which England won 3–0 and the First match of a five match Test series between England and India. In addition, the final of the inaugural World Test Championship took place at Lords from June 11<sup>th</sup> until 15<sup>th</sup>. South Africa won this tournament. The ongoing County Championship matches continued throughout the month

In Lawn Tennis, there were two major Championships in the build up to Wimbledon, The annual event at Queen's from June 16<sup>th</sup> until 22<sup>nd</sup> and in our region the Eastbourne Championships took place from June 21<sup>st</sup> until June 28<sup>th</sup>. This year's Wimbledon takes place from June 30<sup>th</sup> until July 14<sup>th</sup>.

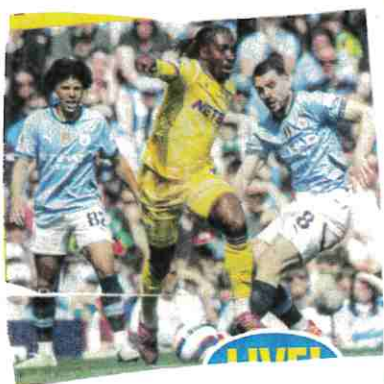
The other two main events this month were in Rugby Union and Golf. In Rugby Union, the British Lions played Argentina in Belfast on June 20<sup>th</sup> and the British Lions began a tour of Australia on June 28<sup>th</sup>. In Golf, the USA Open Golf Championships took place from June 12<sup>th</sup> until June 15<sup>th</sup>.

## Stoolball

Stoolball is a traditional bat and ball game which originated in Sussex in the fifteenth century. This game is thought as an ancestor of Cricket, Baseball and Rounders. Milkmaids played the game using their milking skills as wickets. For this game, each team comprised a mixture of both men and women, so all the teams were of mixed gender. Runs were scored by hitting a ball and running between wickets. This game, in which people of all ages participated was also used as a rehabilitation sport for injured soldiers from the First World War in 1917. The popularity of stoolball has declined since the 1960's but the game is still played at local level by teams of women and mixed gender today. The game was mainly played in Sussex, Surrey, Kent and the Midlands, where it is still played today. Although never a National sport, the game was recognised as a sport by the Sports Council in 2008. The governing body of stoolball is Stoolball England.
